



TITLE I Parent and Family Engagement Policy

1. Each year the Aurora Title I instructors and administrators shall notify parents in a timely manner that their child (children) will be eligible to participate in the Title I program
2. The Aurora Elementary School will hold an annual Title I meeting at a convenient time for parents and family members where these items and others will be reviewed:
 - a. the Title I plan
 - b. the School-Parent Compact
 - c. the Title I Parent and Family Engagement Policy
 - d. how parents can participate, as appropriate, in decisions relating to the education of their children.
3. Parents, family members, staff members and administration shall provide for regular consultations that pertain to this program by the use of parent conferences, materials sent home, meetings, etc.
4. School officials shall provide a timely response to parent recommendations or concerns by using school adopted procedures.
5. School officials shall support parents and family members in the following ways:
 - a. provide timely information about the Title I Program, a description and explanation of the District's curriculum, the forms of academic assessment used to measure student progress, and the achievement levels of the State academic standards
 - b. provide meeting space and materials needed
 - b. training and information needed regarding the program
 - c. opportunities to observe program in operation
 - d. opportunities to become involved through home learning activities
 - e. sufficient funds to provide a good program, if available
 - f. provide information in a language parents can understand
6. School officials will coordinate and integrate parental involvement programs and activities with other Federal, State and local programs.
